Opening Ourselves Up

On Sunday, June 4, I'll begin a series of sermans an Matthew 5-7, the Serman an the Maunt. My words will fall far short of Jesus' master teaching, partly because he's so good at it, and partly because I just have so many thoughts to try to organize and convey. I've always thought that if I were to do doctoral work, I'd want the focus of my study to be in this area. The thing is, it's one thing to study it or understand it, but another thing all together to live into the teaching. At its essence, the teaching is about opening ourselves up, seeing ourselves in the world differently. I came across this prayer of Archbishop Desmand Tutu, adapted from a prayer of Sir Francis Drake, which speaks to the hope of the series. I hope you might find yourself in this writing, I know I did:

Disturb us, O Lord

when we are too well-pleased with ourselves when our dreams have come true because we dreamed too little, because we sailed too close to the shore.

Disturb us, O Lord

when with the abundance of things we possess,
we have lost our thirst for the water of life
when, having fallen in love with time,
we have ceased to dream of eternity
and in our efforts to build a new earth,
we have allowed our vision of Heaven to grow dim.

Stirus, O Lord

to dare more boldly, to venture into wider seas
where storms show Thy mastery,
where losing sight of land, we shall find the stars.
In the name of Him who pushed back the horizons of our hopes
and invited the brave


