


#### Relating

One of the most difficult things about being a pastor is leaving a church. All relationships are expected to be cut off, at least for a certain period, typically at least a year. A few weeks before I finished my work at my prior church, my regional pastor reached out to me and laid out the rules that I knew all too well, mostly because I expected my predecessors to abide by them. The idea is to move on and give the person who replaces you the space to forge new relationships—and to move an yourself. It's healthy for everyone if you stop and think about it. Inevitably, what happened to me on the day I write this reflection happens—members of a family in my old church reach out to let you know that the matriarch of the family has passed away. I had a long relationship with her, and my heart is hurting and is aware of the time we spent together, of walking through a difficult situation, and the space now between us. This type of grief is a new, challenging feeling for me professionally, but I'm so grateful to have had those experiences with her.

Pastors are relational by nature. As much as space and time allows, we desire to have personal relationships with the members of our congregations (this is one of about one hundred reasons I'll never pastor a really big church). Being an interim pastor is a new thing for me, something I've been feeling my way through. Unlike other situations I've been in, my time at NWCC will end relatively soon, at a time that I can't predict, and more relationships will end. That doesn't mean that I don't want to have relationships with you! I'm doing my best to get around and visit some of our langer-term members. You can rely on finding me in my office on Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00-4:00. If you have questions, cancerns, or brilliance to share, stop in or reach out and I'll come to you.

We have now completed the documents needed to post our Pastoral position with the Ohio Region. This is a major milestone in the Pastoral Search Process. The information has been sent to Rev. Harris, our Regional Minister. The documents will be reviewed by the Regional Office and unless additional information is needed, the invitation for candidates to submit resumes for consideration will be posted.

We have reached Step 6 in the search process: Our Regional Minister will send profiles of potential candidates for review to the PSC.

As we have said before, we cannot share information about the number of candidates, the names of candidates, or whether a particular person has applied.

The next step in the process (Step 7) will be the for the PSC to discern a short list of possible candidates from the profiles submitted.




Share God's love with others, invite them to NWCC!

# GENEROSITY:

2 Timothy 3:14-17 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

This passage is frequently used to encourage believers to continue to read and learn God's Word to help us know how to maintain and grow in our walk with God. Reading and absorbing the Bible is crucial for this effort.

I ran across an article that pointed out some additional context to the phrase "God-Breathed" from verse 16. We usually take this to be describing the origin of our scriptures as being God Himself. However the original Greek word for this phrase is not used anywhere else in the New Testament.

When theologians checked secular sources for the meaning of the word they found in all cases that it described the reader rather than the writer. This implies that God's word not only comes from Him, but that the intention is for God to participate with us in our reading of scripture.

That brings a whole new dimension for us in our devotions and our relationship with His Word. The Holy Spirit is not only within the words, but also within us as we read and consider what those words mean to us.

## Where's the beef? NNEMAP And the turkey? And the chicken? And the pork? And the seafood?






