

Comings and Goings

What a whirlwind it has been the past few months. As I heard that pastoral candidate interviews were beginning, I started to work up my profile (like a long form resume for pastors). As I heard the second round of interviews might be starting up, my profile was approved by the powers- that-be and I began to circulate my information to churches who were seeking a pastor. Around that time, my wife sought and received approval to work entirely remotely, opening my search from Central Ohio to, well, the United States.

The church I thought I really wanted passed on me—fast. Perhaps the search committee experienced a similar thing-maybe a candidate that they thought looked great on paper but withdrew early in the process because they were snatched up by a different congregation. Job searches, no matter if you're the person seeking employment or the employer seeking an employee, is usually trying. As much time as is spent on the presenting document—my profile, all told, was nearly 30 pages long (now imagine reading through a stack of them for a number of candidates)—thoughts conveyed on paper only go so far. My interest in First Christian Church in Wilson, NC, where I'll begin as Senior Pastor in January, was tepid. After a 90-minute zoom interview, I was totally convinced that I was called to that group, and I learned soon enough that they felt the same way. When they started their search, I'm sure a UCC pastor from Ohio was the last thing on their minds. I thought it would be nice to end up in North Carolina-in the Western part, in a UCC church. Wilson is 90 miles from the Atlantic Ocean, and FCC is so steeped in Disciples culture that its building is the home to the Regional Office in North Carolina, and Barton College, a Disciples university, is less than two miles away. Man (me, in this case) plans, God laughs.

There's no way to explain the way our paths have come together and now diverge again, without bringing God's call into the conversation. Sometimes we think we know what we want. Sometimes we think we know who we want. Proverbs 16:9 says it best: "The human mind plans the way, but the Lord directs the steps." I've always been a believer in the idea that things generally work out the way they are supposed to, although I fight against the idea most of the time. Friends, as my friend Rev. Joyce Wealand prepares to start her ministry here the day after mine ends, all I can say is that my belief that things end up the way they're supposed to has been reinforced.

Lighting the Advent Wreath: please let Rebecca know if you would like to light our wreath during our Worship Services at 10:30 for Advent: December 3, December 10, December 17 or December 24. Everything you need will be sent to you in advance and it's a wonderful way to prepare for the coming of our Lord.
