John 6:43-46 Jesus said, "Don't bicker among yourselves over me. You're not in charge here. The Father who sent me is in charge. He draws people to me-that's the only way you'll ever come. Only then do I do my work, putting people together, setting them on their feet, ready for the End. This is what the prophets meant when they wrote, 'And then they will all be personally taught by God.' Anyone who has spent any time at all listening to the Father, really listening and therefore learning, comes to me to be taught personally-to see it with his own eyes, hear it with his own ears, from me, since I have it firsthand from the Father. No one has seen the Father except the One who has his Being alongside the Father-and you can see me. [The Message]

Listening is an important part of being a Christian. We need to listen to God, to each other, and to those who are in need of talking. But listening to God is only a first step; we also need to remember what we have heard - memorize if necessary.

I recently read an article by Kyle Davidson Bair who pointed out how important it was for listening and learning in Jesus' time. Writing implements and paper were not common commodities for ordinary people. So people would learn about their religion in their temple from the Rabbi. Many serious Jews memorized passages.

Jesus' process was just like that. He talked and people listened carefully and remembered what he said and the principles he was teaching. The disciples heard much more than the crowds did, and had more responsibility to memorize what Jesus had said. They were then assigned to go out and preach exactly what they were taught - God's Word, not theirs.

The net result was that the apostles went out and taught what they had learned directly from Jesus and were careful to be accurate in what He said. They didn't add or subtract anything.

Thus, Jesus's words were passed on orally for quite a few years until people went through the difficult process of writing things down.

Talk about being Good Stewards of God's Word! We can do the same thing. Thoroughly learn what God wants to know, and pass it along to others we encounter who also need to know those things.

Quarry Trails Metro Park Sunday Hike


