ANote from Your Pastor

A new year begins...

But before we jump straight into 2025, I want to take a moment and reflect on the blessing of the last several weeks of Advent.

This may sound a bit clichéd, but my favorite words of Advent are: Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. When we choose to think of these words, not as emotions that come over us, but as intentional choices we can make, they take on different meaning. Rev. Allen Harris, our Regional Minister and President for the Christian Church in Ohio (Disciples of Christ), shared a wonderful message here earlier this year where he challenged us to cultivate Hope as a core value. We don't have to wait for circumstances to present themselves so that we can experience Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. In a time when there is disconnect and discord between friends and family, when there is unrest in our communities and in our souls, the Good News is that we can still choose to view our world through a lens of Hope. We can determine our words and actions based on a core value of Peace. We can recognize and find Joy in the presence of God in everything we do. And we can choose to live our lives in Love, knowing we are God's Beloveds, as is everyone else we meet.

The words of Advent can continue on with us into the future.

And now, we look forward to 2025. What story will we tell in 2025? And how will we tell it? As we take steps to share the love of God out into our world, where will our intention lead us? Can we be bold in our commitment to spread God's love to all?

My prayer is that as 2025 unfolds we will hold on to the "Yes" and "Let it Be with Me" that Mary found in her heart when the angel delivered the news of Jesus' upcoming birth. I prayer we can, like Joseph, hear the words "Do not be afraid" as we discern our next steps and determine how we will answer God's call on our lives. The shepherds ran, and the angels sang. May we, in our time and place, find our legs and voices and tell the story so it is heard and felt and experienced in our world today. May it be so.

Extravagant Generosity

John 16:31-33 Jesus answered them, "Do you finally believe? In fact, you're about tomake a run for it—saving your own skins and abandoning me. But I'm not abandoned. The Father is with me. I've told you all this so that trusting me, you will be unshakable and assured, deeply at peace. In this godless world you will continue to experience difficulties. But take heart! I've conquered the world. {The Message)

When the new year arrives, we tend to increase our hope that things will get better. We make resolutions to improve. We party and celebrate. However, reality catches up with us fairly quickly and that hope on the new year disappears.

We have the same financial difficulties, the same relationship difficulties, and the same self-discipline difficulties we had only a few weeks ago. We still live in a sinful world with the same problems.

Jesus, in this passage, was trying to offer assurances to his disciples about the coming problems looming in their own lives as a result of his arrest and crucifixion. Notice that Jesus' reaction is deep peace because the Father is with Him. If we had that strong of a sense of God's presence in our lives, we would have deep peace also.

Money and relationships and our own failings would be of no importance. God'sparticipation in life with us would be our top awareness, not the world's problems.

Let us pray that we come closer to that reality.
