Happy Birthday To Us!

June 8 in the Sunday when we celebrate Pentecost — considered to be the "birthday" of the church. On Pentecost Sunday, the disciples weregathered, and the Spirit blew among them. The Fire of who and what the church could be — for all people — was ignited. There was excitement, enthusiasm, euphoria! There was commitment, connection, covenant!

But that was then, and this is now. We may wonder if we can experience that same excitement and fire. We're in a very different culture and in a very different time. Or are we?

When we look at the issues that Jesus brought attention to – feeding the hungry, liberating the oppressed, tending to the poor and imprisoned – are they really any different from what we struggle with today? And when we consider the underlying tensions of empire – the inhumane treatment of some by those in power because their basic human dignity was not valued – has it changed today?

Perhaps it's time to let the Spirit blow into our lives, like the disciples of the past. Dare we pray for the Spirit to blow away our complacency, our privilege, our clinging to our status quo? Can we open our ears to hear God's message, then free our hearts and minds and hands and tongues to share that message in ways that others may hear and understand? Will we risk bringing the issues and tension into our conversations and discernment of our mission as God's church?

As we celebrate the birthday of the church, there will be balloons. There will be energy in our worship. And there will be cake! May there also be commitment to modeling our mission in the Spirit filled way of Jesus. Thanks be to God for wind and fire! Thanks be to God for Spirit and energy! And thanks be to God for each of us and our desire to make a difference in our world today, like the disciples made a difference all those years ago. Happy Birthday to us all.

EXTRAVAGANT Generosity

Romans 12:1-3 So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking—around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you. I'm speaking to you out of deep gratitude for all that God has given me, and especially as I have responsibilities in relation to you. Living then, as every one of you does, in pure grace, it's important that you not misinterpret yourselves as people who are bringing this goodness to God. No, God brings it all to you. The only accurate way to understand ourselves is by what God is and by what he does for us, not by what we are and what we do for him. (The Message)

Too often in today's world we tend to think things should be larger than life. We make neon signs, develop extravagant performances, value expensive stuff, and we applaud heroes for doing outstanding things.

Yet in Romans, Paul is stressing how important and valuable ordinary life is. God wants us to just be our normal selves doing normal things, but do them in the presence of God. Paul stresses that our normal lives done with goodness is a gift from God, not the other way around.

We sometimes think that when we place our time and talents into God's hands that we have accomplished something. But the truth is that God brings His hands to our time and talents. They are His accomplishments, not ours. The best thing we can do is to stay in God's presence as we go through our normal days doing our normal tasks. It's not mundane; its holy.


